

## <u>TIP 1</u>

# Begin a project with an end in mind

- Envision the finish line, your goal.
  - This helps you remain true to it & keeps you focused

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


SMART goals are statements that turn a vision into an actional plan

## <u>TIP 2</u>

# Understand the goal & make it SMART

- Before diving into tasks understand the mission
  - This helps keep everyone on track toward the objectives
  - This helps to say 'no' when someone attempts to derail the vision



# TIP 4, Manage Risks




# TIP 5, Avoid Perfectionism

 Forget about perfectionism and instead focus on the project goal

• Aim at the big picture and don't let details slow you down.
