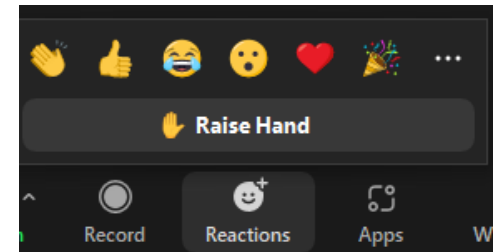

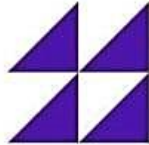


# Project Economy Superpowers

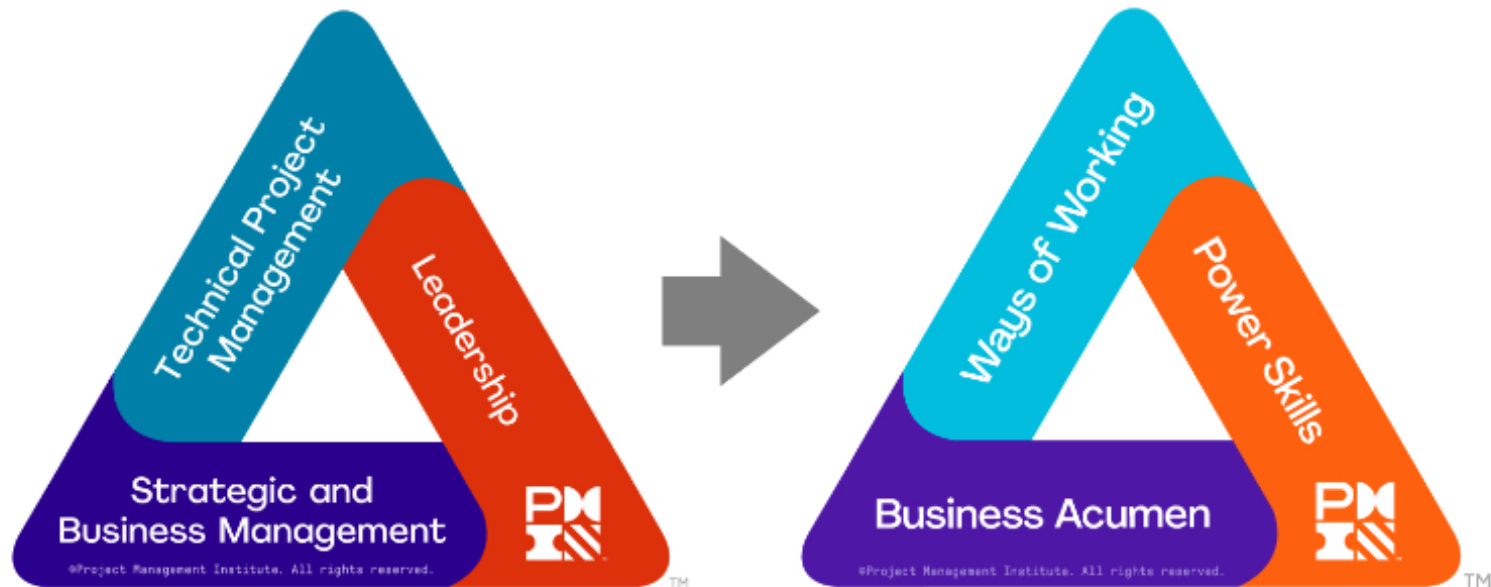

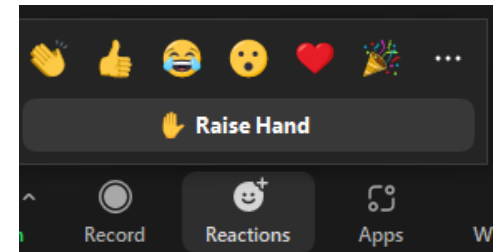
